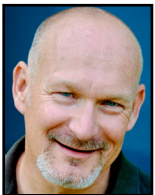
LuAnne Pezel

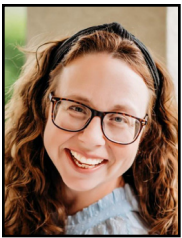

Author Bio

Joseph Kesselring

(Author/Playwright) – Joseph Otto Kesselring was born in New York City on June 21, 1902. His career was always linked in some way to the theatre. His early years were spent as a singer (boy soprano and adult tenor), and at the age of twenty, he began teaching music and directing amateur theatre productions at Bethel College in Newton, Kansas. At twenty-three, he left academia to pursue acting, writing short stories, and producing vaudeville plays. He acted professionally in *GENTLEMEN PREFER BLONDES* at the age of twenty-four and, at thirty-one, one year after his marriage to Charlotte Elsheimer, he devoted himself to writing, continuing to pen short stories and initiating his career as a playwright. Between 1933 and his death in 1967, he authored twelve plays—mostly light comedies. His first play to be produced, *AGGIE APPLEBY, MAKER OF MEN*, premiered in 1933, and four later plays were produced on Broadway: *THERE'S WISDOM IN WOMEN* (1935), *ARSENIC AND OLD LACE* (1941), *FOUR TWELVES ARE 48* (1951), and *MOTHER OF THAT WISDOM* (1963). Mr. Kesselring died on November 5, 1967, at the age of sixty-five.

Welcome, ladies and gentlemen, to the Brewster House.
The time is late September 1941.
The place is Brooklyn, New York.
A quieter time.

A 'simpler' time.

A peaceful time – though still a tense time. We are, after all, only six weeks away from the attack on Pearl Harbor, the devastating event that would catapult the United States into World War II.

....but we're not there yet.

Allow me, ladies and gentlemen, to introduce you to the Brewster sisters: Abby and Martha. The kindest, sweetest ladies you'll ever meet. They'd give you the clothes off their backs if it would help you out. You want a meal? They'll feed you. A place to stay? They'll house you. 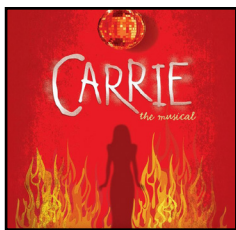

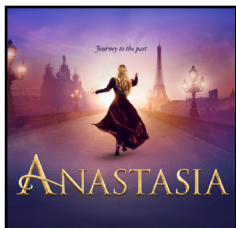
